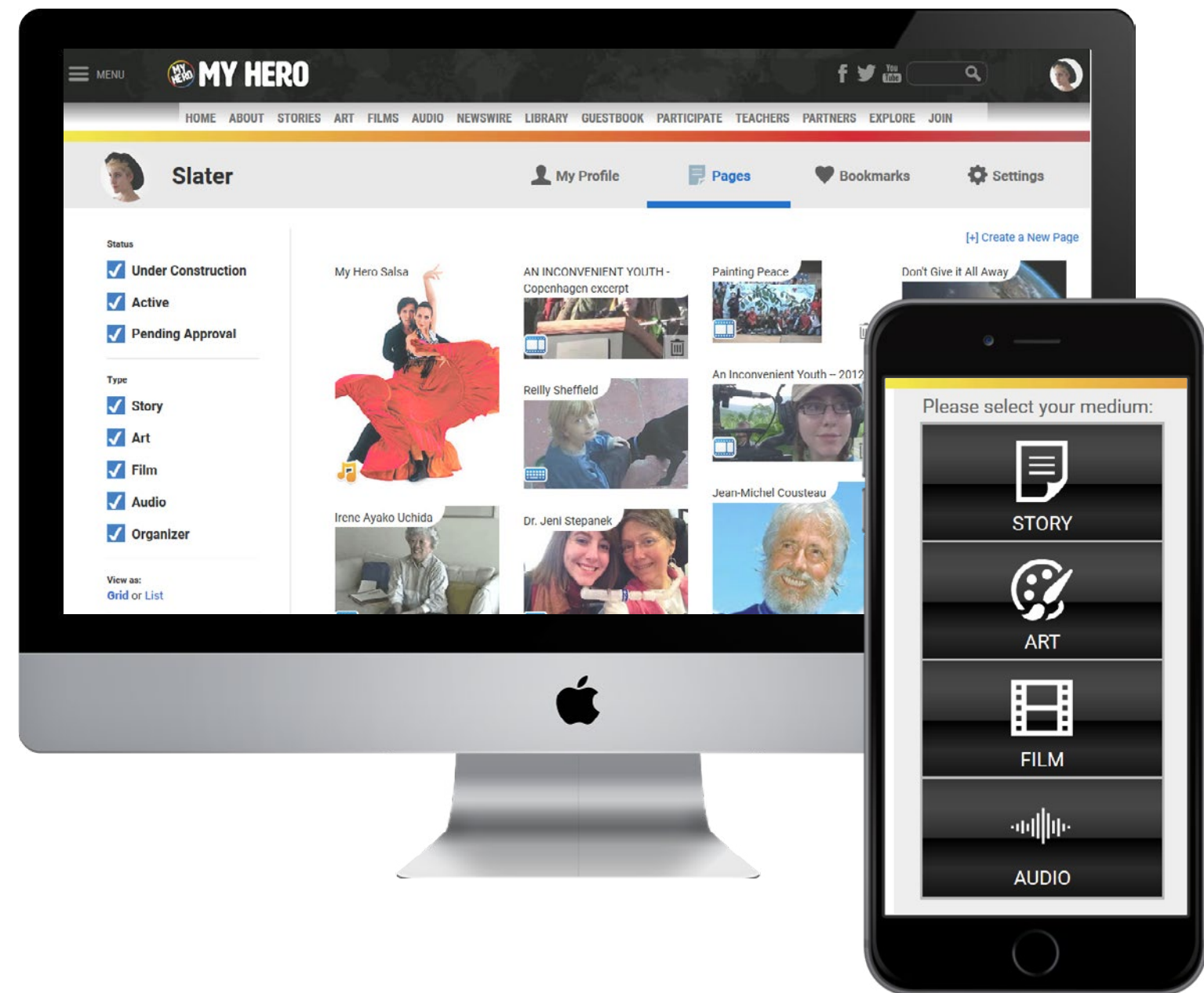


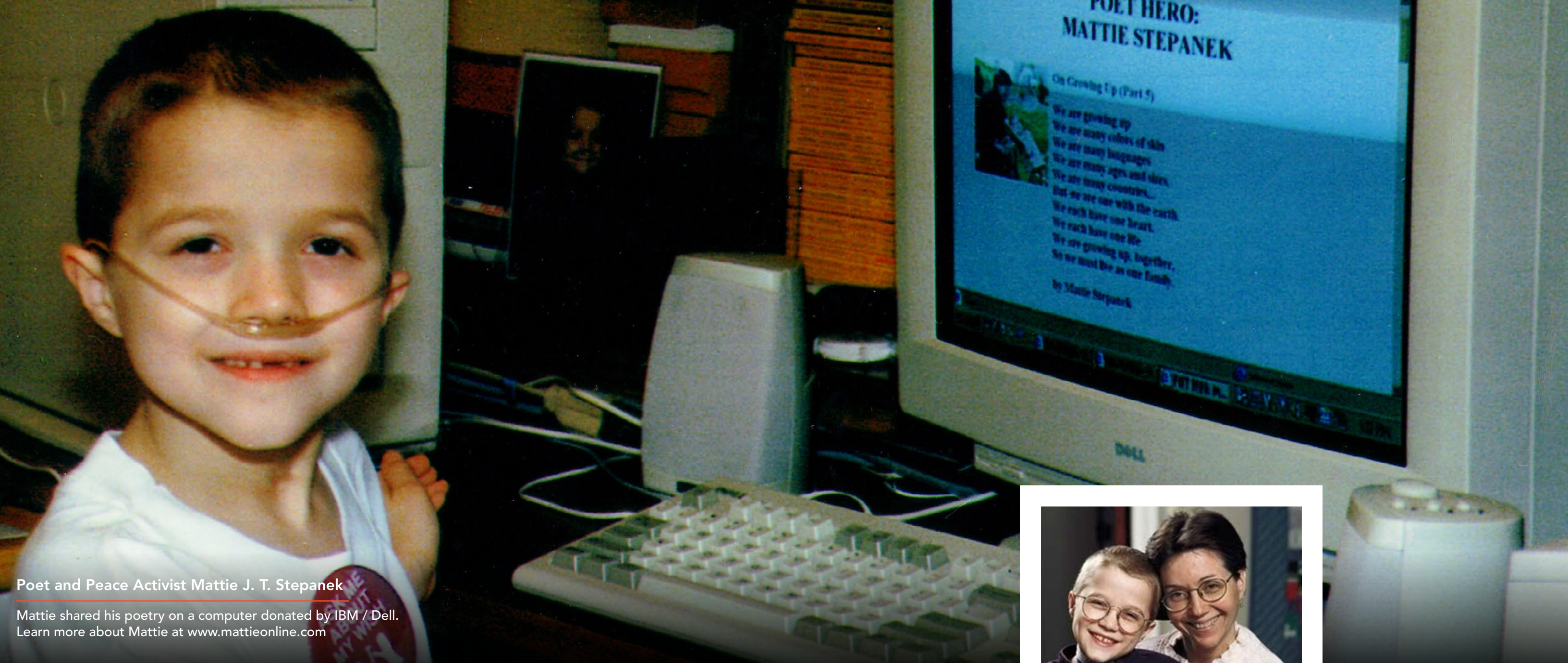

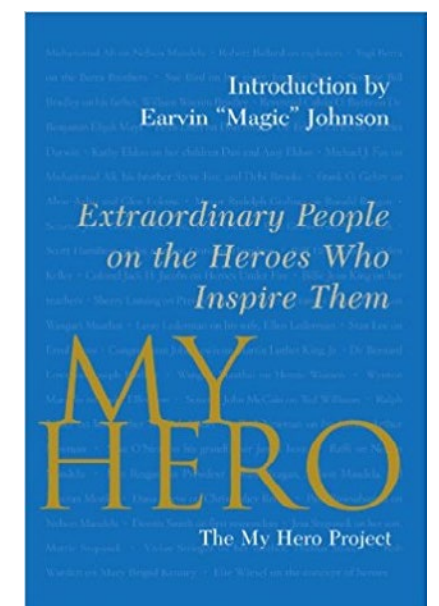

Wangari Maathai is founder of The Green Belt Movement, an organization that has mobilized thousands of Kenyans, mostly women, to plant more than 30 million trees across the country, providing much-needed firewood, lumber, shade, and food.

"Women have an innate sense of service. It is part of who we are. We give rise to new life by nurturing it inside us for nine months. 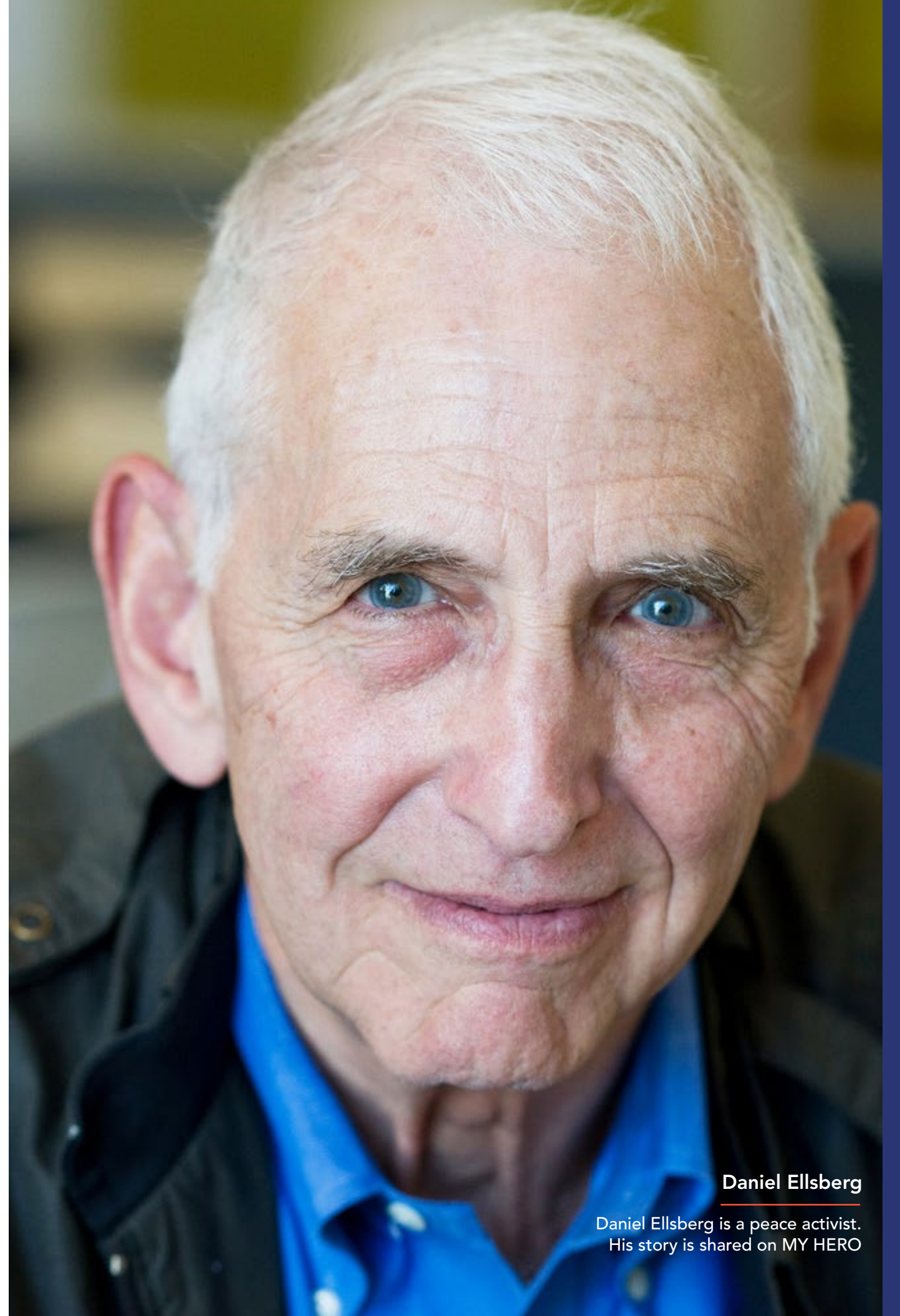
Daniel Ellsberg is an outspoken champion for whistleblowers working for the cause of peace.

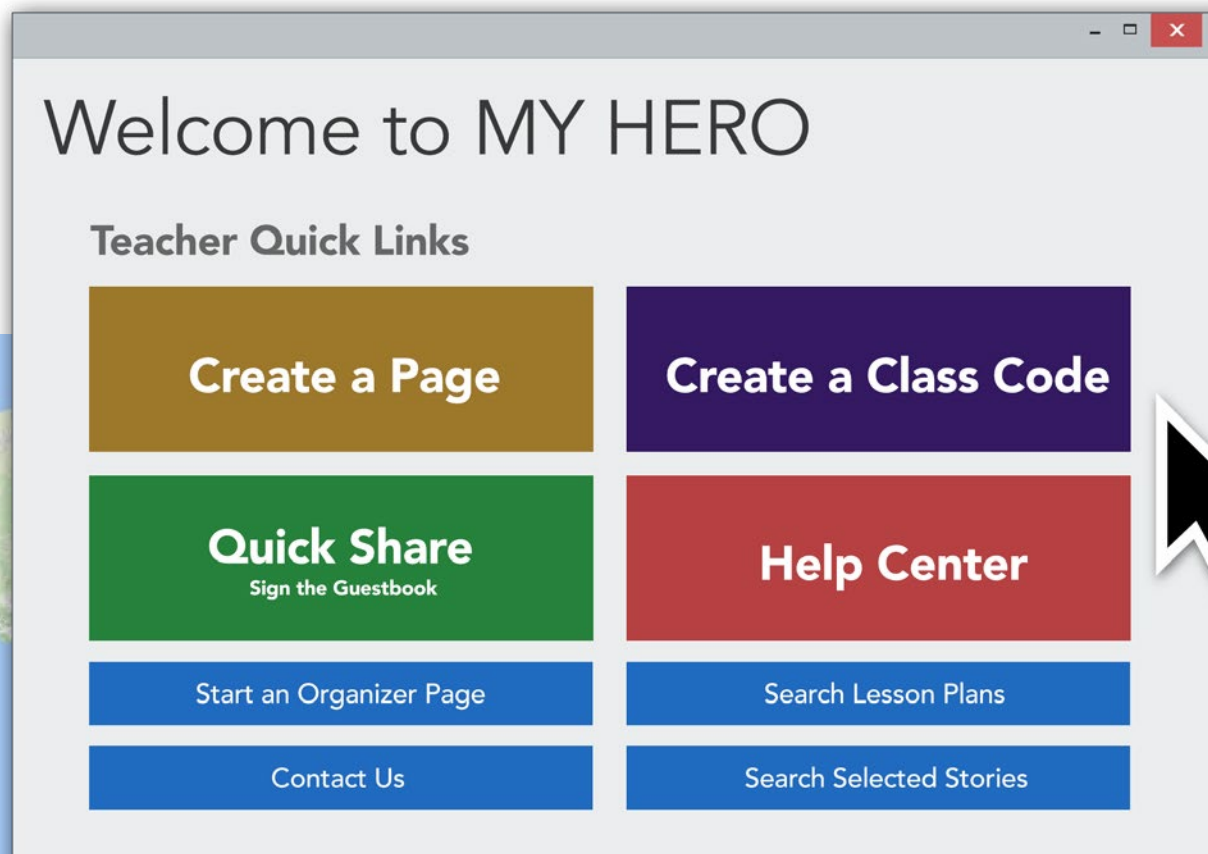
TEACHER'S ROOM
