We wanted children to have access to information about real life heroes who had overcome obstacles, faced great and small challenges and succeeded. During the early days of the web, we launched this project hoping that, if we built a venue online to share stories of hope and inspiration, others would join in the project and children would benefit.

Today, MY HERO is a leading destination for teachers and students around the world. We provide digital storytelling tools and a rich multimedia library that is used by people of all ages. Our global learning community includes professional filmmakers, writers and artists who join with teachers and students adding content to this ever-growing internet archive. Working together we are building the world's largest online media library of hero stories, art, and films.

A team of educators, media makers, programmers, web designers, and editors manage this multi-media project. As the internet has grown so has our need for bandwidth and improved technology. We want to improve our systems and delivery so that more students entering the digital age will access our resources and join in this celebration. Together we are working to bridge the digital divide, and bring inspiration to millions of students.



Web-authoring tools have been designed for visitors to use to create and publish web pages with images, text and links, honoring heroes from all walks of life. The web-authoring program is used in homes, classrooms, after-school, vocational and library programs. MY HERO has been integrated across interdisciplinary school curricula to advance core standards-based learning and to build critical thinking, reading, writing and media literacy skills.

In 2013, MY HERO staff reviewed, edited and activated 2,774 essay submissions from over 2,581 schools. 91 t-shirt prizes were awarded to authors whose essays were featured on the website


Multimedia Library: Virtual Art Gallery


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Multimedia Library: Films



MY HERO has added a SPANISH LANGUAGE component to our digital toolkit. We hope to expand the cross cultural opportunities available through the MY HERO website with this resource. These tools provide spanish-speaking visitors the opportunity to use our web authoring programs in their native language. This personal Multimedia Database can be accessed year after year to create a unique record of growth, achievement, development and creativity. Proficiency with media and technology are important life skills and the MY HERO Media Portfolio is a great way to gain experience creating and publishing essays, art, music and films. Students work on media projects at home, in the library or at school. Media submitted to MY HERO is reviewed by staff. Once approved media can be shared online with classmates, family members and visitors from around the world. Growing a personal digital portfolio of inspirational content can also help students showcase creative work to colleges and/or future employers.

TEACHERS RESOURCES

The MY HERO Teacher's Room combines our vast database of stories, art, films and audio with tools and resources that help teachers bring MY HERO into the classroom.

We provide standards-aligned lesson plans and project-based learning programs across various disciplines including English, Social Studies, Art, Media Arts, Science and Environmental Studies, English as a Second Language (ESL), Character Education, and Special and Gifted Education.

Teachers share lesson plans, resources and tips on integrating MY HERO into their classrooms in Teachers Room online. Teachers use the MY HERO ORGANIZER TOOL to create a "Classroom Portfolio." This tool helps teachers bring together students' stories, art, films, and audio work published on MY HERO into an online directory. Publishing a Classroom Portfolio online is a great way to showcase student work for parents, students and the community members.

Search MY HERO's vast library of content and create a THEMATIC ORGANIZER web page that can serve as a multimedia resource for classroom assignments. Examples of organizers include: Tribute to Nelson Mandela, Hispanic Heritage Month Heroes, International Day of Human Rights, World Water Day and more...

In 2013, more than 320,000 visitors, worldwide, visited the MY HERO Teacher's Room for educational resources, tutorials, and lesson plans. More than a thousand educators (including partners) officially registered for a MY HERO educator account. Nearly half were from nations outside the United States. Approximately 41% of the U.S. participants were from low-income families. More than half were of an ethnic minority.

Feedback and surveys from teachers help us evaluate and improve this interactive website as a platform for creative expression, collaborative learning and cross-cultural communication. According to the surveys, teachers turn to MY HERO to help strengthen skills in writing/communication (26%), character education (18%), web page building (16%), and for research purposes (13%).

In partnership with the International Education and Resource Network (iEARN.org),

MY HERO LEARNING CIRCLES stimulate dynamic, interactive, and online global exchanges that bring the world into the classroom and the classroom into the world. Learning Circles act as virtual classrooms that enable students to communicate and collaborate with peers across the globe. Teachers and students learn about each other's cultures, communities and heroes. The digital portal MY HERO launched in 2012 for the MY HERO Global Learning Circles in the new Teachers Room continues to be a great success and resource.

In 2013, a total of 52 Elementary, Middle and High School classes (incorporating approximately 1,300 students) participated in the MY HERO Learning Circles, collaborating on the topic of heroism by incorporating journalism, art, audio and short films into their curricula. The Circles were very diverse and included participants from the following countries: USA, Canada, Belarus, Romania, Ukraine, Russia, South Africa, Taiwan, Slovenia, Pakistan, Mexico, Kenya, Bangladesh, Australia, Georgia, Morocco, Iran.

MY HERO Media Arts Educators provide training and mentorship to students and teachers around the world with an emphasis on sharing stories about those making a positive difference in the world.

The MEDIA ARTS curricula and tutorials are freely available online, providing users of all ages with instructions on how to use new technologies to express themselves and develop important media literacy skills. Educational materials and resources are adaptable for multiple subjects and grade levels.

Through tutorials, live workshops, one-on-one trainings and direct communication via skype, our media arts educators ensure that student filmmakers and teachers receive the support they need to be successful at all stages of the production process.

MY HERO Media Arts Educators have led workshops in Morocco, Jordan, Egypt, Senegal, Netherlands, Qatar, Slovakia, Russia, China, Japan, Canada, Mexico, Colombia, Nepal and across the United States.

Both locally and internationally, The MY HERO Project provides media resources and technical training to teachers of underserved youth. MY HERO distributes DVDs, books and USB drives with lesson plans to those who lack internet access. Partner organizations such as The American Film Institute provide materials to help students get started making short films honoring their own heroes.

Our Media Arts Educators make sure that all appropriate, student-made short films and media projects created for this program can be uploaded to the MY **HERO** website and shared with its international learning community.

The MY HERO International Film Festival is an annual event held in the George Lucas building at the USC School of Cinematic Arts, every fall. In 2013, the 9th MY HERO Interntaional Film Festival received over 300 submissions. Entries came in from all over the world, including Ukraine, Brazil, Belarus, Canada, Nepal, India, Kenya, South Africa, the United Kingdom, Switzerland, Guam, England, Iran, Indonesia, Egypt, Australia, Mexico, Bangladesh, Hungary, Morocco, China, Philippines, France, Ghana, Senegal, Pakistan, Guatemala, Slovenia, Slovakia, Spain, Italy, Netherlands, Denmark, Algeria, Lebanon, Germany, Malaysia, Korea, Russia, Nigeria, Sweden, Armenia, Greece, Japan, Serbia, Austria, and the United States.

Our festival explores the theme of heroism in documentary, narrative, animation and experimental short films, and supports the crucial work of real life heroes and passionate filmmakers by recognizing their efforts before a worldwide audience in **The MY HERO** Screening Room.

Each year, special prizes are awarded to filmmakers who showcase those working for peace and tolerance, ranging from social activists to environmental conservationists. To introduce our award-winning programs to the general public, The MY HERO Project inaugurated a Salon Series, an educational community forum, on the Third Thursday of each month at the Herb Alpert Educational Village. The MY HERO Salons provide guest speakers, film screenings, art exhibitions, musical performances and interactive discussions with professional writers, filmmakers and visual and performing artists. Each Salon is devoted to a theme that echoes the Capshaw-Spielberg Center's commitment to education and social justice.




Celebrate Eco-Heroism

CELEBRATE ECO-HEROISM (PDF)

Launched in 2012 at the Laguna Beach Boys and Girls Club, "Celebrate Eco-Heroism" was a 12-week afterschool pilot program. Elementary students developed media literacy and environmental awareness watching award-winning films, learning digital filmmaking techniques, interviewing local environmental stewards, and creating artworks that celebrated eco-heroism. The curriculum for this model program is available online, and can be modified for use in the classroom or after-school programs.

With support from a grant from the Puffin Foundation and The Massen Greene Foundation MY HERO created a DVD and companion guide to provide inspiring short films about environmental heroes and resources to launch an eco-heroism program in schools and after school programs. The DVD's were distributed to teachers at the PEN Conference, The iEARN International Conference in Qatar and the 2013 ISTE conference. They are freely available upon request.





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
