ASKING QUESTIONS

LENGTH: 60-90 MIN.

OBJECTIVES

Students will...

- Use K.W.L to plan out what questions may need to be answered
- Learn how to structure your hero's story using beginning, middle, and end.
- Use this structure to better understand your hero's life and impact.
- Write interview questions based on this structure.

OPENING DISCUSSION

Watch and Learn

Watch this <u>60 second film</u> of Project I Am and ask students the following questions:

- **01.** What makes Jahkil a hero?
- **02.** What makes Jahkil different from a celebrity

ACTIVITY ONE: KWL

Know- What do you already know about your hero?

Wonder- What do you wonder about your hero?

Learn- What can you ask to learn more about your hero?

ACTIVITY ONE: KWL

In your notebooks, make a list of...

All the things you **KNOW** about your hero.
All the things you **WONDER** about your hero.

In your film, you will ask questions to **LEARN** about your hero. Next, will help you write your questions.

THREE PARTS OF A STORY: BEGINNING-MIDDLE-END

A good way to think of questions is to consider you hero's **beginning**, **middle**, **and end** (or future).

The **beginning** is the start of their life. What got them to where they are today? Examples:

- Where were they born?
- Where did they go to school?

The **middle** is their life right now. What are they currently doing? Examples:

- What is their job?
- What is a project they're working on?

The **end, or future**, is their life going forward. What are their plans? Examples:

- What is their dream?
- What do they want to work on next?

ACTIVITY TWO: WRITING YOUR QUESTIONS

Divide Your Hero's Life into 3 sections: Beginning, Middle, End (Future)

Write 3-5 questions for each section on a separate piece of paper

LEVEL UP: GUIDED RESEARCH

For older or more advanced students, you can use the following sections in the workbook to encourage further research into their heroes.

CLOSING DISCUSSION

Ask students if they can identify...

- What does KWL mean?
- What are the three parts of a story?
